Well Repairs

Our well repair team has for the past two months been engaged with well repairing in the zones that are under the OJS ministry. To date, our team has repaired 41 boreholes that have seen a total of 59,829 people benefitting from the service. One borehole can be used by almost 5 villages.



Evangelism

While our well repair team was out repairing boreholes, we sent with them some of the pastors and volunteers for the ministry to go and do evangelism in the villages. Our pastors and volunteers used several strategies that were developed and adopted such as; Proclaimers, Messengers, Bracelets, E-Cube, E-Ball, Salvation Parachute, and Outreach programs. These activities have seen 24,685 reached with the Gospel and 5,281 give their life to Jesus Christ.



Zone Leaders Training

The O|S ministry invited its Zone Leaders for training on March 6, 2021, which was attended by 22 Zone Leaders. Each Zone Leader received the following items; salvation bracelets, E-cubes, and messengers that will help them share the Gospel in their different zones effectively. As a ministry we believe that the use of such materials attracts attention from people and hence the advantage of our pastors to effectively do the work of the Lord.

CEF Training

The O|S ministry later invited its CEF leaders for a mentorship training and to also provide them with materials that they can go to their different childrens' groups and share the materials provided to them. The ministry distributed 9,000 CEF materials to 16 leaders. The CEF material was received from Mailbox Club, a ministry that works on teaching children about Jesus Christ. Our ministry strongly believes that the materials that were distributed will have a positive impact on the expansion of the Kingdom of God through reaching these young children.

Pastors Theological Program with Hands on Africa (HOA)

Our ministry has this year made partnership with Hands on Africa, a ministry that trains pastors and provides them with Associate Bachelors Degree. The O|S ministry intends to start a school in collaboration with Hands on Africa within the month of April. We will implement the Program beginning with 40 Pastors. The Program will last three years.

Local Partnerships

ABC Literature from Zomba, Malawi has donated to our ministry materials amounting to 18,000 that will be used to share and spread the Gospel. These materials include; 2021 Calendars, St. John Booklets, Zochitika Munthu Afaka (What happens when a person dies), Mbedza Yobisika (Hidden hook), and Zinthu Zisanu ndi Ziwiri (Seven things). As a ministry we are grateful that local ministries are partnering and providing us such needed materials to boost our agenda on reaching people with the Word of God.

Prior to the donation received from ABC Literature, the ministry also received CEF mentorship materials from Mailbox Club through its Country Coordinator, Bishop Lawrence Chitedze. Mailbox Club donated 9,000 CEF materials to our ministry, and these materials were distributed to our CEF Leaders during their training program in March.

Solar Water Project (SWP)

As it was previously mentioned in our January Newsletter, it is with excitement that our ministry is now in the final preparation stage of a project that will see schools and hospitals across Lilongwe areas receive new solar powered boreholes. We hope the project will be implemented before the coming month. Our purpose as a ministry through our water project is to continue providing clean water to the most remote areas and at the same time bringing the love of Jesus Christ to His people.
